Arrangements for Carillon: Carlo van Ulft

CARLO VAN ULFT has been Director/Carillonist of the Thomas Rees Memorial Carillon in Springfield, Illinois, since July, 2015. Mr. van Ulft, a native of The Netherlands, holds European Master's Level degrees in organ performance, carillon performance and theatre organ performance. He served on the faculty of the "Royal Carillon School, Jef Denyn" in Mechelen (Belgium) from 1984-1997, held positions as Municipal Carillonist in four cities in the Netherlands and was Director/Carillonist of the Centralia (Illinois) carillon for 18 years before moving to Springfield.

Mr. van Ulft founded the North American Carillon School (NACS) in 2012 to serve carillonists of all ages and skill levels. He is an active member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA) serving in the past on the Board of Directors and numerous sub-committees. In 2014, Carlo authored the book *Arranging for the Carillon* and as an arranger & composer, many of his works have been published and are in widespread circulation. In 2015, he helped produce the professionally filmed DVD "Meet the Carillon." A frequent guest recitalist, he has played at all major carillon festivals & summer series in North America & Europe and has been an invited guest player at several GCNA congresses and World Carillon Federation (WCF) congresses.

As adjudicator, Carlo has judged both nationally and internationally. He was awarded the Medal of Honor of the University of California-Berkeley in 1993 for "distinguished service to the carillon."

During the academic year, Carlo plays a weekly concert and teaches the art of carillon playing at Principia College in Elsah, Illinois. As organist, he serves the congregation of St. John's Lutheran church in Springfield, Illinois.

DR. LINDA DZURIS became Clemson's first University Carillonneur in 1999 and is Chair of the Department of Performing Arts. Additionally, Dzuris is a performance instructor of the North American Carillon School, which was established in 2013 as affiliate and American representative of the Royal Carillon School 'Jef Denyn' in Mechelen, Belgium.

She received her B.M., M.M., and D.M.A. degrees in organ performance and church music from the University of Michigan. Carillon study was also done in Ann Arbor, MI, with additional study at The Netherlands Carillon School in Amersfoort, NL. Dzuris is Vice-President of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA) and has been a featured guest artist in carillon concert series throughout the United States, The Netherlands, France, and Switzerland.

In 2017, Dzuris performed concerts on behalf of the GCNA at the 19th World Carillon Federation (WCF) Congress held in Barcelona, Spain and currently serves as a North American delegate to the WCF. American Carillon Music Editions and the Yale Guild of Carillonneurs publish her original carillon compositions.





MARCEL SIEBERS learned to play the piano when he was seven. He studied at the Conservatory of Arnhem with Janine van Mever. He later studied Carillon at the Dutch Carillon school in Amersfoort with Arie Abbenes being awarded a master's diploma. Marcel has written several compositions for various instruments and ensembles. Some of his works for Carillon have won international awards.

As a composer, Marcel joined the Foundation of Composers from Limburg. In 2008 he received the culture prize of Cuijk and in 2016 he was awarded with the "Bronze Merlet" for distinguished cultural service in the Cuijk region. Marcel Siebers is carillonneur in Venlo, Cuijk and in Huissen. In addition to his carillon activities, he also plays piano in the "Gulden €uro Trio."




TIM SLEEP was appointed Naperville City Carillonneur in 2007 where he teaches and performs regularly on the Millennium Carillon, Naperville, Illinois. He has performed carillon recitals at Rockefeller Memorial Chapel, University of Chicago, the Chicago Botanic Gardens and guest recitals throughout the country. He is also an Instructor for the North American Carillon School.

Mr. Sleep is a former President of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA) previously serving as its Corresponding Secretary, board member and Vice President. He has performed on the New Music recitals at various GCNA congresses.

He began his carillon studies with Wylie Crawford in Naperville and continued with John Gouwens at the Culver Academies in Culver, Indiana, becoming a Carillonneur member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America in 2004. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from North Central College in Naperville and a Master of Science in Educational Administration from Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, Illinois. A retired band director and middle school principal, he is long-time church musician currently serving as organist for Knox Presbyterian Church in Naperville.



ALEX JOHNSON (b. 1997) is currently the University Carillonist of the University of Chicago. In this role, he teaches a studio of about 20 students and regularly plays the 72-bell 100-ton Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial Carillon housed in Rockefeller Memorial Chapel. Alex serves on multiple committees of the nonprofit, The Guild of Carillonneurs in North America, and he is an avid composer, improviser, and supporter of new music.

Previously, Alex has taught carillon at the University of Texas at Austin and the University of Rochester. He also taught high school math in Austin, Texas. Alex studied carillon at the Royal Carillon School "Jef Denyn" in Belgium, at Bok Tower Gardens in Florida, and at the University of Rochester, from where he actually obtained a degree in physics. In 2019, he won 1st Prize at the most prestigious carillon competition, the 8th International Queen Fabiola Carillon Competition. Alex has also dabbled in mbira, gamelan, and several forms of dance.
